

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The Marmi Maximum collection by Fiandre Architectural Surfaces

Fiandre Architectural Surfaces has launched nine new shades to offer designers and architects even more tools. Marmi Maximum, one of the brand's premium collections, has recently been expanded with new formats, now also with new colours.

After introducing formats that have a lower impact on the environment, Fiandre Architectural Surfaces has updated its Marmi Maximum collection by adding nine new surfaces with a marble effect: Bardiglio Sublime, Breccia Marbre, Calacatta Dorato, Crema Superiore, Lepanto Rubino Nero Damascato, Divine Blue, Grand Carrara and Majestic Onyx.

The new textures are available in the large format (300x150 cm) and in smaller sizes (150x150, 150x75, 75x75 and 75x37.5 cm) in order to offer an extensive selection of floor and wall compositions for installations on ventilated facades.

Designed to add prestige to residential and public spaces, Fiandre's 300x150 cm format measures 4.5m² and is 6mm thick. Its large surface and thin width make it an ideal solution not only for cladding spacious areas, but also for creating customised elements such as bathroom furnishings, tables and countertops, sliding doors, movable partitions, wall units and seating.

Maximum surfaces are not only resistant, durable and easy to clean and maintain, but are also designed to be sustainable. In fact, they are produced in zero-emission plants where processing waste is fed back into the production cycle. This means they are much more sustainable, which also makes it possible to preserve natural resources.

These nine new shades, inspired by the finest marbles, brighten up rooms with their luminous and sophisticated textures, which give each space a unique look. They are suitable for decorating private homes, accommodation facilities and spas, stores and showrooms, bars and restaurants, medical clinics and corporate headquarters.

The new colours

Bardiglio Sublime



A microcrystalline structure with a glassy heart. The sky grey background is veiled with veins, some of which are fluffy, others threadlike. At times, the lines, which run almost parallel, are interrupted as if cut with tailoring scissors: the clouded texture of the marble therefore changes, generating and regenerating its layers.
Finishes: polished, semi-polished

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Breccia Mirabile



The structure, with its many veins, and its noble vibe, gives it an air of ancient splendour. The binder, with its classic violet hues, draws free-form shapes on the warm white background, while the green or pinkish hues are combined with almost golden accents. Polychromy is perfectly accomplished.
Finisher: polished, semi-polished

Cielo e Terra Dorato



Gold and grey veins run along the ivory white background, forming discontinuous patterns that create a sense of movement on the surface. The accuracy of details such as streaks and crystallisations does nothing but enhance the sophisticated texture.
Finisher: polished, semi-polished

Cremo Superiore



The background is in a specific shade of ivory, which is solid but extremely delicate, traversed lengthwise by a fading cascade of stripes and streaks: these are aligned and laid out in a web in which mineral pigments gradually melt out, thus creating thick pearly grey veins or bright beige marks.
Finisher: polished, semi-polished

Ligante Rubino



The brecciated pattern becomes majestic and regal: it weaves an intricate web of milky white veins on the purple and burnt-orange coat, interspersed here and there with darker, cooler streaks. The mineral artwork, with its rigor and unpredictability, has a consistent aesthetic appeal which, at the same time, is also intensely variable.
Finisher: polished, semi-polished

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Moro Damascata
Like a theatre backdrop, marble artworks are put on show, which light up with an intense decorative warmth. Mineral analogues form and interweave on the surface, almost like small brownish gold flames which, in an undulating motion, add warmth and bring out the dramatic and mysterious appeal of the mineral coat.
Finishes: polished, satin



Grand Carrara
Against a grey limestone background, several graphic layers create an austere and unpredictable masterpiece. White veins have scattered graffiti, as if made with a pencil. Right below them, the crystalline pigments of the base can be seen between the meshes of a very fine net of adi-calcined minerals.
Finishes: polished



Shiva Blue
Crisp, clean, airy, yet powerful, the stone fulfils its expressive role in a deep and vibrant marine blue, exuding elegance and beauty and, at the same time, a contrasting lightness. Symmetrical shapes in subtle colours, achieved through bookmatching, perfectly enhance every trace and shade - from a sharp, very light vein to green or cobalt blue pigments.
Finishes: polished



Majestic Days
A pattern of beige and creamy-white streaks runs through the brown marble coat, continuously merging into new shapes and shadows. On the background, more veins between the flowers and then gently dissolve. The concentric structure is reminiscent of the various materials and stratified minerals of the original stone, creating a playful and highly elegant texture.
Finishes: polished

Dezeen Showroom: Italian brand Fiandre Architectural Surfaces has launched a collection of antibacterial finishing tiles called Luce, which create a mesmerising play of light through sinuous lines and a chiaroscuro effect.

Presented exclusively at Cersaie 2021, the Luce collection was designed by Guillermo Mariotto for Iris Ceramica Group.



Luce is distinguished by the interplay of light and shadow, which creates a chiaroscuro effect

The collection references how light is able to "reveal, mould, draw and sculpt matter".

The tiles feature swirling lines and abstract reflections that create an interplay of light and shadow, which brings depth to architectural spaces.

"The unparalleled expressive and communicative force of light is the inspiration that brings shape to this exclusive project, taking architectural spaces to a new dimension," said Fiandre.

The tiles can be used as flooring, wall coverings, cladding and for furnishings

The tiles are suitable for indoor and outdoor applications and are intended for commercial and residential settings, as well as external facades. The material can also be used for furnishings and accessories.

The Luce range is available with Fiambre's patented Active Surfaces innovation, in which ceramic slabs are transformed into eco-active materials via a process called photocatalysis.



The tiles are antibacterial, anti-viral, anti-odour and self-cleaning

These high-performance materials replicate the properties of titanium dioxide combined with silver, which results in an oxidation reaction that makes the materials antibacterial, anti-viral, anti-odour and self-cleaning.

The tiles come in a neutral palette of six iridescent shades including pearl, black, blue, gold, silver and grey.

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

Les dalles en grès cérame de la collection Fjord s'inspirent du charme énigmatique des terres du Nord ; là où la pierre façonne et anime le paysage, là où toute la force de la nature s'exprime dans l'érosion des roches, là où les imposantes falaises rocheuses dominent la mer du Nord.

Le camaïeu ton sur ton qui compose la gamme chromatique de Fjord évoque les pâles surfaces rocheuses dessinées par le temps et par les forces telluriques.

Extrêmement polyvalente, la collection Fjord peut être appliquée dans des espaces intérieurs comme extérieurs ; contemporaine et minimaliste ou élégante et raffinée, Fjord trouve parfaitement sa place dans différentes atmosphères.

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La collection est disponible dans les formats 120x60, 60x60 et 60x30 cm, dans la finition semi-brillante, avec une épaisseur de 8 et 11 mm. Ces mêmes formats sont disponibles dans les tonalités Dusty Fjord, Grey Fjord et Sand Fjord, avec une épaisseur de 11 mm et dans la finition structurée.

Fiandre a récemment introduit le nouveau format 100x100 cm, dans l'épaisseur de 2 cm, pour les couleurs Dusty Fjord, Grey Fjord et Sand Fjord. La surface structurée présente un coefficient de frottement et de glissance R11 A+B+C, pensé pour une utilisation en sol extérieur dans les jardins et les terrasses, mais également pour une pose dans des zones aquatiques.

Dans le format traditionnel, Fjord est complétée par les formats grande dalle de la collection Fjord Maximum (300x100cm et 100x100 cm, 6 mm d'épaisseur) pour les couleurs White Fjord, Sand Fjord, Grey Fjord et Dusty Fjord, afin de répondre aux nombreux besoins de la construction.





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
